April 7, 2016

The Board of County Commissioners of Clark County, Indiana met in Regular Session on April 7, 2016, at 5:00 p.m. in Room 404, Clark County Government Building, Jeffersonville, Indiana.

Approval of the Minutes

Commissioner Stephenson motioned to approve March 24, 2016, Regular Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 3-0.

Approval of Claims/Payroll

Auditor Snelling presented the claims and payroll stating that the mandate is now in place. Commissioner Stephenson motioned to approve the claims and payroll for April 13, 2016. Commissioner Glover seconded. Motion approved 3-0.

- **B.** Lindon Dodd, with Community Corrections, presented the PREA Auditing Services Agreement. This audit would make sure that Community Corrections is in compliance. The cost would be \$4,500 for the audit fee plus \$600 extra. This is a state statute audit that they are bringing to the attention of the commissioners.
