RESOLUTION NO. 4-2022

**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE TRANSFER OF  
PERSONAL PROPERTY TO THE TOWN OF BORDEN**

**WHEREAS**, Clark County, Indiana (“Clark County”) is a governmental entity under the Indiana Code;

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners of Clark County (“Clark County Commissioners”) serves and functions as the legislative and executive body of Clark County;

**WHEREAS**, the Clark County Sheriff is an elected officeholder of Clark County;

**WHEREAS**, the Borden Town Council (“Council”) serves and functions as the legislative and executive body of the Town of Borden, Indiana (“Town”);

**WHEREAS**, Ind. Code 36-1-11-8 authorizes governmental entities to exchange or transfer property for any or no amount of cash or property, provided that both governmental entities adopt substantially identical resolutions;

**WHEREAS**, the Clark County Commissioners, with the consent of the Clark County Sheriff, have elected to transfer personal property to the Town;

**WHEREAS**, said personal property is a 2015 Ford Taurus Police Interceptor vehicle to be used by the Borden Town Marshal for public safety;

**WHEREAS**, this transfer is being made to the Town for no consideration.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Clark County Commissioners as follows:

1. That each and every recital set forth herein is adopted into this Resolution, made a part hereof and made operable as a result of the signatures below;
2. That Clark County hereby transfers any right, title and interest that Clark County may have in the said 2015 Ford Taurus Police Interceptor vehicle to the Town of Borden.

3. That the Clark County Sheriff and/or the President of the Clark County Commissioners are hereby authorized to execute documents effectuating the transfer of the personal property described above;
4. That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption and contingent upon the Town of Borden adopting a substantially similar resolution accepting the title and accepting all liability for the said motor vehicles.
